Wonderful Christmas filled with knowing that God Loves You !!!

I thought the “Christmas message” would be the last message I would have to share with you. After all, I had shared with you all that I had to share—I felt I had nothing left to share. In the message entitled, “The Approaching Horses ...” found at this website I referenced a writing* from 12/25/2017 which instructs us to “listen to the chatter of the riders on the horses.” So throughout our messages, and especially in the Christmas message, we shared with you to watch North Korea. From a writing dated 1/4/2013, “... Debbie, far in the East, people of many nations are planning the demise of your nation. This is a people whose leaders know nothing of Me or My love for all people. They know nothing of Jesus’ sacrifice so they could have eternal life in Heaven. They know only of war, building for war, training for war, equipping for war in order to conquer and rise above their position of weakness to a nation of great power—having done their part in reducing your nation to a position of powerlessness. These are men who have been deceived by evil to begin what was never to happen but happens....”

I share this with you once again, because I now have a greater understanding of what this means. Beyond the obvious, one needs to review the statement, “listen to the chatter ...,” and that is what we have been doing. I shared with you about the first ride on a white horse to the top of the mountain by the NK leader and at that time he spoke of a “great operation to strike the world with wonder again,” as reported by many news sources. You see, throughout December there was another ride to the top of the mountain and we listened again. He spoke of a “Christmas Gift” that was to come. We prepared in ways you have no idea. And Christmas came and went and no “Christmas Gift.” And then we waited to hear the speech that was to come on New Year’s Day. It wasn’t like the speech of years before; it was included at the culmination of a 4 day meeting where we learned that there was a “shocking actual action to make the US pay for the pains suffered by North Korea under the Washington—led sanctions regime,” as reported by news agency, KCNA. And there was also the announcement: “The world will witness a new strategic weapon (in the near future)” Could these statements be linked to the statement regarding “striking the world with wonder?” This is “chatter” that we believe the Lord has shown us to watch for. It was not said in “peace;” it was said in defiance as if planning for attack—a time we have been shown to Prepare for.

So, you may be saying, Debbie, you titled this message, “Compassion.” What does this have to do with compassion? As we were seeking to hear about the latest “chatter,” we discovered other voices. We came across a YouTube Channel and there we heard the most amazing stories of those who had defected from North Korea to South Korea. Their stories made my own husband cry. They told of how they had starved to the point of death and risked their lives time and time again to reach China. They told of even when they made it to China, they still were not safe because the Chinese would send them back to North Korea where they would face torture and imprisonment for daring to escape. Some, who were successful crossed the Gobi Desert, a 3000 mile journey to reach the South Korean Embassy in Mongolia where they were then allowed to go to South Korea. They shared what it was to be free. They also shared the reason they risked their lives was for a bowl of rice—they had nothing to eat in North Korea and knew they would die if they didn’t take the risk.

But the main purpose for sharing this message is what they said about Compassion. They had no compassion—they were never taught about compassion. They cared about their family members and the “great” NK leader, but for no one else. Corpses were left in the street when the people died of starvation—no one dared help anyone. No one had anything. One young man talked about his father and how he shared what little the father had with his son—and the son still watched his father die of starvation. They shared how they risked their lives to escape to China for one reason—a bowl of rice. We have shared some links** so you can learn about their journeys for yourself. I can’t do them justice, here.

But as we listened to these stories, my husband reminded me of what the Lord has taught us about compassion and the selfish self-centered nature of man. We have learned that compassion has to be learned. It is the wilderness journey where we are rid of our selfish self-centered natures that we truly embrace the love of others (compassion). We were also reminded of the writing that I shared at the beginning of this message and I had shared in the Christmas message. Those who defected told of how they were taught that Americans were bstrds and how their “great” NK leader was a god—one young woman feared that the leader of NK could hear her thoughts—so even her thoughts could betray her.

As I watched one journey after another, I could only think what does God think? He sees the people suffering. There are many Christians and more and more are learning that they have been deceived which causes fear in the leaders. These young people who were sharing their journeys were risking their lives by doing so, but they are so compelled to let the rest of the world know the truth.

So, what about Compassion? First and foremost, we need to hear the Lord and listen for His direction to know how to help others. Not everyone is equipped to help everyone in need. And not everyone will receive help in the way that you have to give it. I share much about this in “Deprogramming and Reprogramming Our Hearts, Minds, and Souls.” The section titled, “Think First” is a good guide to use in order to help others. Remember, that on an airplane if there is a difficulty a parent is instructed to put on their mask/oxygen before their child’s. Sometimes you have to take care of yourself before you can be of help to anyone else. By addressing the questions found at “Think First,” you can assess your ability to help someone in need. Maybe it is best to seek help from someone else. But if you have the ability, make sure you are not being strung along/used/or deceived, then evaluate and offer help if you assess you can.

As I listened to those who made it to South Korea, it was the fact they did nothing to help those dying that seemed to cause them the most distress. Know your strengths. Know your limitations. Know your abilities. Remember, Jesus did not heal everyone that suffered. Know that there are people who will deplete you of everything you have. To give them all you have is not compassion. Listen to your heart. The Lord has shown me that I can’t help everyone—to do so is causing them to rely on me and not Him. He wants them to seek Him; we just point the way. And, remember, God does not require us to be perfect, but have compassion. Continue to “listen for the chatter.” Know that God has a plan and much help He has provided/available at this website. And, pray for the people in North Korea.
